Intelcan clinches military modernization contract in Romania

Ottawa, ON, Canada – October 14, 2004. Intelcan, a leading global provider of air traffic management systems and airport infrastructure, announced today it signed a US\$24 million contract with the Romanian Ministry of Defence to modernize Romania's Campia-Turzii and Boboc military airports to NATO- and ICAO-compliant standards. This contract—one of several major turnkey contracts awarded to Intelcan recently—provides communications, navigation and surveillance systems to bring Romania's military airfields in synch with NATO member countries.

"This contract is testament to Romania's confidence in Intelcan's products and services," said Ron Weissberger, president of Intelcan Technosystems Inc. "Our proven technology is instrumental in minimizing risks and successfully managing multi-million dollar contracts in foreign markets. We look forward to commencing the strategic planning process in QIV, 2004 with Romania's two new airbases being fully operational by 2007."

Intelcan will supply and integrate its state-of-the-art ATM system with a new Ground Control Approach Radar, Aerodrome Surveillance, and Secondary Surveillance Radars. The Intelcan ATM system includes a multi-radar data processing system with sophisticated short-term conflict alert and minimum safe altitude warning features. Previously, in 1999, the Romanian Ministry of Defence awarded Intelcan a contract for the turnkey modernization of three major military airports and prior to that, in 1996, Intelcan upgraded Hidroelectrica's technology to deliver on yet another contract with Romania.

"We're pleased to have Intelcan at the helm for such an important contract," commented a key member of the Romanian contract negotiating team.
